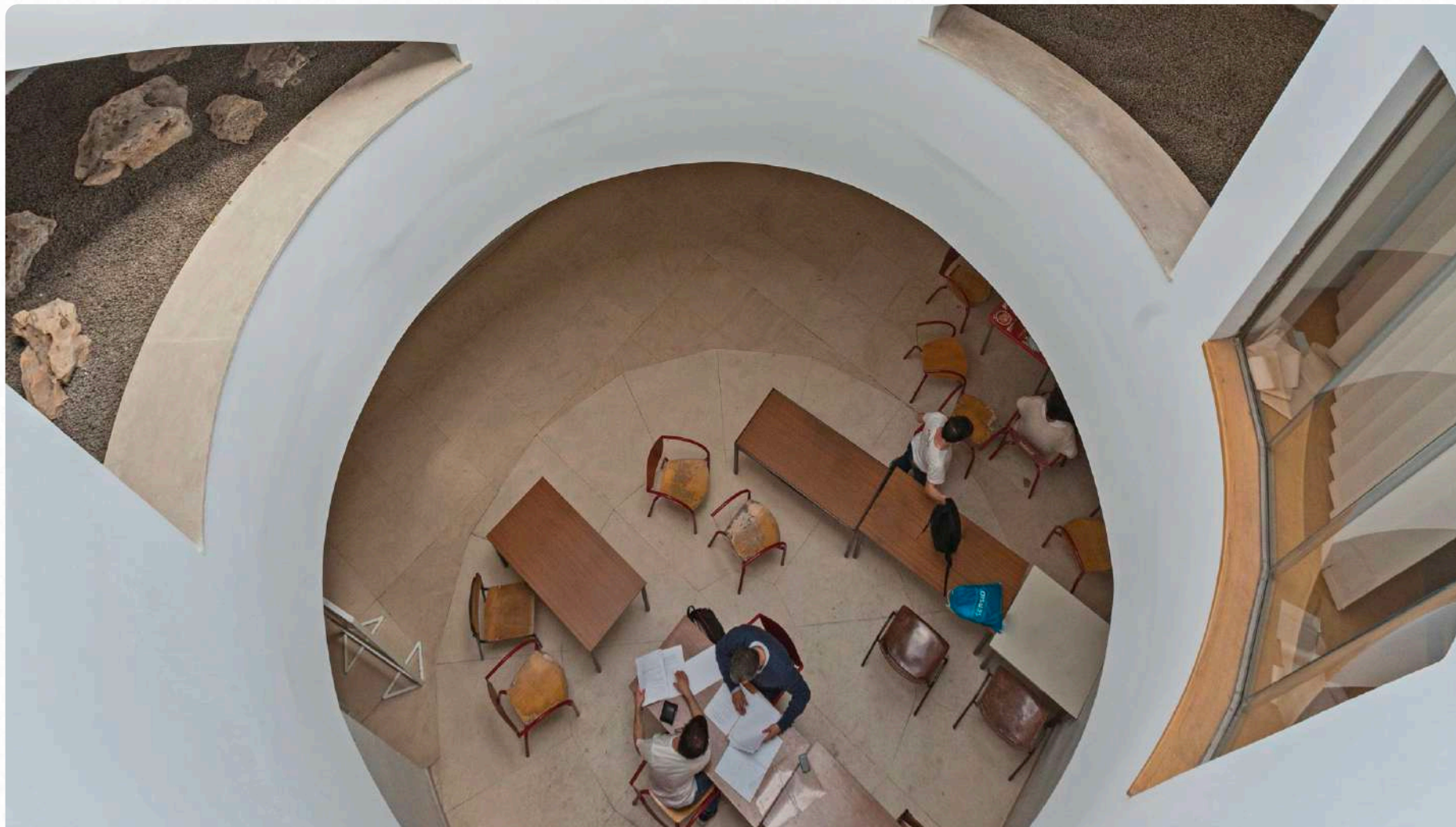

Health Services

In Portugal, most people are entitled to health care from Serviço Nacional de Saúde (SNS)- National Health Service.

If you are an EU/EEA citizen and come as a student, you are legally entitled to get medical benefits through the public system.

For this, you should bring your European Health Insurance Card (*) issued by the social security service of your country.

If you are a non-EU citizen or your country does not have a mutual Health Care Agreement with Portugal it is convenient to sign a private medical insurance.

Students who have not the European Health Insurance Card or a private medical insurance will have to pay the health treatment, in case they need medical assistance.

The students of the University of Lisbon have access to the Health Centre, since they present the Student's Card.

To make a complementary diagnostic examination the student must present the Social Security Card or any other health system.

Wi-fi on Campus

All students enrolled are given a campus email account which allows them to use the University's Wireless Internet Network (Eduroam).

Students can configure their mobile devices and personal computers in the Informatic Services of the School they attend

Transportation

The University of Lisbon Campus is served by different types of public transportation, subway, buses and taxis are the main ones.

Students can file a request for a monthly transportation pass that allows them to use buses and subway within the Lisbon metropolitan area (30€/month) or Lisbon and other metropolitan areas around it (40€/month).

Insurance

Residency Permit

All students must file a request for a residency permit that can be obtained through the proper services.

Student Visa

Students from countries outside of the European Union and of the European Economic Area need a study visa before entering in Portugal. For obtaining the visa, students must request in advance an Acceptance Letter from the University.

The study visa must be requested in an Embassy or in a Portuguese consular post in the country of origin.

We advise you to place the study visa request at least one month before coming to Portugal.

To enter Portuguese territory foreign citizens need:

- To have a travel document that expires over three months after the last day of your intended stay;
- To have a visa that is valid and adequate to the purpose of the stay. This visa should always be requested at a diplomatic mission or at a Portuguese consular post that is based abroad;
- Have sufficient means of subsistence for the durations of the stay;
- To not be registered in the SEF Integrated Information System, nor in the Schengen Information System.
