



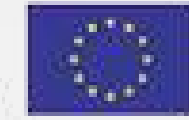

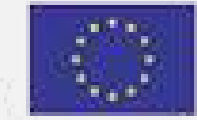

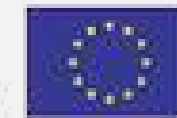

The student Visa is valid for multiple entries each academic year.

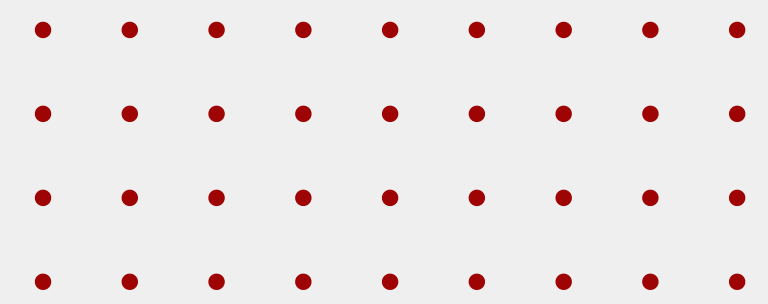

Opening a bank account

Foreign students can open a bank accounts in Indian banks with the help of the following documents - **passport, proof of status - an NRI, PIO or OCI document, proof of current address** such as a recent utility bill, bank statements, correspondence with a government department or authority, proof of permanent address (Indian or overseas), driving license (if it bears your address), or passport for example and passport photos.

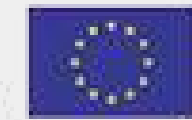
A few banks near the University of Mumbai (Kalina campus) are **IndusInd bank, Bank of Baroda and ICICI bank**.

Students should go to the **International Cooperation Office** to be enrolled and get their student cards. They should bring the following documents:

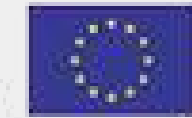

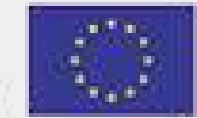
Accommodation

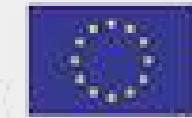

Using bicycles on campus is a good way of getting around. Bicycles could be bought second hand or could be rented.





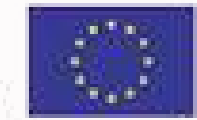

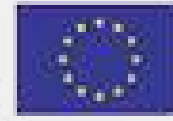
